Executive Board Meeting

1. Received report on preparation for annual meeting (August 1981) from Bruce Curran.
2. With reference to an honorarium for Ted Webster for his talk on 5 June AAPM/NESRO meeting, the Board agreed that it would be appropriate for NESRO to offer him such an honorarium since that has been their policy in the past for guest speakers, even though Ted is a New England Chapter AAPM member. Bob Wenstrup will communicate this to Ed Epp.
3. Bruce Curran will arrange dinner reservations at the 5 June AAPM/NESRO meeting for the participants in the Young Investigators' Symposium.
4. Received a report from Education Committee Chairperson, Robert Zamenhoff. He has formed a committee of Phil Judy, Bob Wenstrup, and Bob Zwicker and is planning a symposium on Digital Radiography for the fall of 1982. The proposed location is Wentworth. Zamenhoff will prepare a proposal for submission to the AAPM Continuing Education Committee without a request for financial participation. He will formulate a budget and seek commercial support for the symposium. He will also apply for ACR credit to attract physicians. Speakers will be asked to provide a text of their presentation at the time of the symposium for publication in a Proceedings.
5. A lengthy discussion was held concerning the Young Investigators' Symposium and Peter Neurath Memorial. Diverse opinions were expressed, but the consensus among those present was that the two should remain linked and that the Neurath Award should be given to the winner of a competition connected with the Y.I.S. It was also decided that there should be a set of criteria established for selecting the competitors in the Y.I.S. and judging the presentations. Further action was tabled until the next Board meeting.

At the Chapter Meeting it was MSC that the Chapter authorize the Chairman of the Legislation and Regulation Committee to respond in writing for the Chapter to the Radiation Control Office of MA concerning the proposed registration of radioactive material and radiation producing devices.
